

FSSAI BEGINS PROJECT ON MICROPLASTIC CONTAMINATION

The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has launched a project to access microplastic contamination in food products and develop methods for its detection.

According to an official statement, the project was started in March.

The aim is to develop and validate analytical methods for detecting micro and nano-plastics in various food products, as well as assess their prevalence and exposure levels in India.

"The primary objectives of this project include developing standard protocols for micro/nano-plastic analysis, conducting intra-and inter-laboratory comparisons, and generating critical data on microplastic exposure levels among consumers,".
